
~Changing Regulations to Achieve Reductions ~ *There are 3 'Tools for Management'*

Catch Rate Survey

- The ASMFC took over October 1 as contractor under NMFS.
- Atlantic coastal states have 2 options: Option 1. Conduct the survey (as a sub-contractor to ASMFC) Option 2. Allow ASMFC to conduct the survey in your state.
- Option 1, conduct the APAIS
- We are in the process of hiring staff, and will be training in the winter to begin field sampling March 1.





Catch Rate Survey (APAIS)/MRIP Update

Effort Survey

- This survey is transitioning from a telephone survey to a mail survey.
- Telephone and mail surveys will be conducted side-by-side for at least 2 more years.
- MRIP estimates will use the telephone survey during that time.

Is there commercial clamming in the Coastal Bays?

- Mechanical dredging for clams in the Coastal Bays has been banned (2008).
- We have heard from the commercial community that they would like to open it up to mechanical harvesting except for hydraulic escalator dredging.
- A legislative bill would be needed for that to change. Commercial clamming is currently limited to any hand gear (ex. rakes).





What commercial fishing is currently being done in the Coastal Bays of Maryland?

What commercial fishing is being considered in the future for the Coastal Bays of Maryland?

- The Department is not specifically developing any new fisheries.
- Macroalgae has been brought to our attention
- Shrimp had some questions about harvesting this year





What is being done about bunker, spot, and finger mullet in the back bays?

- Menhaden ASMFC FMP
- Stock assessment is in the works for spot
- We are not currently managing white or striped mullet. They are measured and counted in our seine survey. Mullet may be included in the MAFMC Unmanaged Forage Species plan.





Comment on the perceived threat to the feed stocks from rays.

- Rays do eat molluscs
- Aquaculture uses netting
- The extent of their impact to hard clams in the Coastal Bays is unknown.
