Blue Crabs



- Hours
 - We are working on this –Will keep you posted on the implementation timelline.
- Declaration
 - Unfavorable / Authority is complicated
 - 5,000 people would be involved
 - Prevent Coastal Bay crabbers from working Chesapeake Bay
 - Expensive

Whelk Girth



- Research revealed that 6" minimum size was too small for channeled whelks to reproduce 1x before harvest (16%)
 - 80-90% mature by 6.5"
 - Would need a 3.5" girth
 - Working with other State Directors to increase minimum size
- Knobbed whelk girth 3.25"
- Channel whelk girth 3.5"

~ HB 916 ~ Mechanical Clam Dredging



- Amended in March for a Study
 - Amendments Included:
 - Using biological reference points to determine if the commercial fishery can open and to set appropriate harvest limits.
 - Evaluate the appropriateness of various gear types.
 - Considering daily electronic reporting / hailing
 - Bill FAILED the Senate yesterday

Smooth Dogfish



- NOAA implemented a Coastal Quota triggering:
 - Implementation of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission Coastal Sharks Fishery Management Plan Addendum II (2013) – State shares
 - Total coastal quota = 2,649,268 lbs
 - MD share = 6.703% = 177,581 lbs
 - Do you want a trip limit or wait to see if one is necessary?
 - 2. Development of draft Addendum IV
 - At least 25% of catch onboard must be smoothhounds to land them with fins removed (removing head and gutting ok)
 - 3. Federal waters has a 2 hour gill net check time, ASMFC voted not to include that provision in draft Addendum IV

HSC, BSB, SF Permits




- Do you want us to continue issuing paper permits for horseshoe crab, black sea bass, and summer flounder?
 - The Department does not need the paper record to monitor quota anymore.
 - It is a place for permitees to have a readily available record in the event of an ITQ transfer.
 - This would not immediately happen.
