2013 MD Park Service & Fisheries Service

License Free Fishing Area (LFFA) Survey (updated 1/27/14)

EXISTING LFFAs - Currently 24 areas; 6 do not meet criteria and 4 marginally meet criteria.

A. Do not meet LFFA criteria:

- 1) Canton Recreational Pier (Baltimore City) in an area impacted by debris from Harris Creek; no signs of being used for fishing or crabbing; parking on the street.
- 2) Hull Street Recreational Pier (Baltimore City) pier has been taken over by the Inner Harbor Connector Ferry Service; posted "No Fishing"; very limited parking
- 3) Bridge #K-004, Still Pond Still Pond Creek (Kent Co.) limited parking alongside the road near the bridge and fishing from the bridge is dangerous.
- 4) Route 213 Bridge, Chestertown Chester River (Kent/QA Co.) no parking at either end of the bridge and this is a high traffic bridge.
- 5) Mill Street Bulkhead, Salisbury Wicomico River (Wicomico Co.) no parking and poor water quality.
- 6) Snow Hill, County Bridge on Porter's Crossing Road west of U.S. Route 113 & east of Route 354 and Pocomoke River (Worcester Co.) limited parking at this site alongside of the road and fishing off of the bridge is dangerous.

B. Marginally meet LFFA criteria:

- 1) Friendship Landing Nanjemoy Creek (Charles Co.)
- 2) Monokin River Park, Princess Anne Monokin River (Somerset Co.)
- 3) Tyaskin Park, Tyaskin Wetipquin Creek/Nanticoke River (Wicomico Co.)
- 4) Cedar Hall Landing Pocomoke River (Worcester Co.)

POSSIBLE NEW LFFAs - Based on LFFA survey feedback from MPS and Fisheries Service Regional staff, the following are areas that should be considered as potential locations for new License Free Fishing Areas.

Western Region:

1) Gambrill Pond at Gambrill State Park – A 1 acre pond with good access that has hybrid Bluegill and is used for fishing rodeo. There is also a part time staffed nature center nearby. Could institute a pilot tackle loaner program at this site to evaluate the feasibility of this option at other state parks. No park entry fee.

Central Region:

- 1) Kittamaqundi Lake at Columbia 27 acre lake near Columbia Mall. Has a user friendly waterfront area. Would need to secure approval of governing body.
- 2) North Point State Park Wooden fishing pier near parking area and just north of Crystal Pier. Good option for replacing 2 Baltimore sites (Canton, Hull St.) that do not meet LFFA criteria. Entry fee: Memorial Day Labor Day \$4.00 for MD residents and \$6.00 for non-residents; Labor Day Memorial Day \$3.00 per vehicle for MD residents and \$5.00 for non-residents.

Southern Region:

- 1) Sweden Point Pier, Smallwood State Park Fishing pier located near marina with access to tidal fishing. Park has a discovery/nature center nearby. Entry fee: April October \$3.00 per person on holidays and weekends, \$3.00 per vehicle weekdays year round, out of state persons add \$2.00 per charge.
- 2) Myrtle Grove Pond, Myrtle Grove Wildlife Management Area 23 acre lake and 10 acre pond, both are stocked with trout. Suggested location is the 10 acre pond.

Eastern Region:

- 1) Federalsburg Municipal Waterfront City owned waterfront park area. Has handicap access fishing area, parking, picnic benches on Marshyhope Creek. Considered tidal.
- 2) Jane's Island State Park Marina Dock area of Daugherty Creek. Near nature center, bulk headed waterfront, might be good location for pilot tackle loaner site. No park entry fee
- 3) Martinak State Park Watts Creek waterfront near boat ramp. Tidal water, good parking and access and nature center nearby. No park entry fee.
